One Track Trainers Review: 2014*

(as of 28/12/14)

Introduction

As 2014 draws to a close I have reviewed the system and the trainers' performance to ensure we are giving ourselves the best chance of making profits.

Below you will see the overall results for 2014 and then the results broken down by trainer as well as a quick commentary on each.

Without doubt it has been a difficult and unprofitable final two month of the year. From July to launch the system was 90 points up betting live but a disappointing final quarter has reduced that to 60 points. Of course everyone who joined the service is yet to make any profit and losses are around -30 points at the moment. I have lost around £600 since launch and the sooner we start backing more winners the better.

The performance in the first three quarters of 2014, and the overall performance of the trainers during the year, should give you confidence that 2015 will be much better. I know many subscribers lost confidence and have left already. While I can understand their frustration I hope you can see the long term potential of this system. The majority of the trainers have had a very good year and it is just a shame that some of their profits were not in the final two months of 2014 but that is how it goes sometimes. I know that this system needs to prove itself live and at the moment it is proving a bit of a struggle but 40% of the runners have finished in the top 2 and the trainers will turn it around.

Considering that we follow quite a few flat trainers as well as some on the AW and NH trainers who would appear to fire after Christmas the next few months will be much better than the previous two. The approach is intended to be used all year round but obviously there are more profitable periods than others. While we all would have liked a much better start over the past 8 weeks the results should be viewed in the context of the whole year, especially when broken down by trainer.

There are no reasons at all why 2015 should not be a repeat of 2014 and I have every confidence in this system moving forward.

Having said that I have reviewed a couple of trainers in depth and made some slight changes. I am always monitoring all trainers however I don't believe you should ever make changes in year, or too hastily. At the start of 2014 there were a couple of areas for 3 trainers that I wanted more evidence for before making any decisions. Having now had another full year of results I am confident that we can tighten up the rules for three trainers to make them more profitable. The review of these trainers, and the slight rule changes, can be found below the results breakdown.

Bill Turner has been profitable to follow however his number of runners this year has been a slight concern. During the previous 4 years he averaged 28 runners a year and is clearly down on that figure during 2014. However, it is a certain type of horse that we back of his and clearly he hasn't had as many of that type run. When they are his only runner at the track they have historically performed very well so hopefully he has more runners in 2015.

Trainer Review

Rae Guest

The performance of Rae's runners at Kempton have been slightly underwhelming as you will see below and until he is more consistent I am now happy to remove these runners.

His performance in 2012 and 2013, especially the placed horses, gave confidence that 2014 would be ok. However after another losing year, and a losing overall record at the course when only sending one runner, I am now confident that we can exclude these runners. He obviously has winners at the course and may well do in the next couple of month but since 2010 his record is underwhelming and unprofitable.

By removing this unprofitable track his results are more solid and it will mean we are not backing as many losers.

We will no longer back his non-handicap hurdlers and handicap chasers. Following a poor 2014 it's clear these runners are to be avoided for now.

Unlike his non handicap hurdlers there is no real logical reason why his performance with handicap chasers should be so poor, especially as his record with non-handicap chasers is decent. I would like to think it is just a case of not having the ammunition to go to war with. I didn't expect 2014 to be so poor but it confirmed that until there is a consistent turn around his handicap chasers should be left well alone.

Overall the win record is poor. As we know there are many trainers who use non-handicap hurdles as a route towards getting a handicap mark and I think that is the case here. While the win % has always been quite poor the place record has always been very good and that did make me think that with a bit more luck his record would turn around. However, we are in the business of backing winners and I am now happy to exclude these runners as the overall win record is poor.

By excluding these runners we are left with a more solid profile and moving forward we can be more confident when backing his horses.

2014 has still been poor but I am happy to forgive any trainer an underwhelming year. His place strike rate does give me confidence moving forward.

All in all I think we can expect a decent 2015. However if he does underperform again I may have to consider his place in the team.

Roger Varian

Quite simply it is now clear that his handicappers up to 7 furlongs are best avoided.

His form with these runners when only sending one runner to the track is as follows...

Overall this is rather poor and for whatever reason it makes no sense to keep backing these runners when the flat season starts again.

His form with handicappers over 7 furlongs +, when only sending one runner, is very solid and these are the horses we will focus on moving forward.

Conclusion

That concludes the review of 2014. With trainer systems it is always important to keep on top of their records and to pick up and act on any underperformance, once you are convinced you have enough evidence. I personally like to see a whole year of results before making any changes, hence why I have reviewed them now. There will be no further changes to the portfolio of trainers until this time next year when I will write another review report. I will of course continue to monitor all of their performances during the next year however I am content with the portfolio as it stands.

The changes to the three trainers will come into effect tomorrow. Of course we have a few months before we are backing Roger Varian's horses.

This group of trainers have made **354 points profit** during the past 12 months. Rather annoyingly for all of us this profit was amassed in the first 9 months of the year. While that is no consolation to our current position I hope that with the above review of all trainers, and the pre 2014 records included in the main manual, you can have confidence moving forward. Having said that I know many people have lost confidence in the approach already but I would urge you to stick with the system and judge it properly after a full year of service. The majority of trainers have performed very well during 2014 and there is no reason why this year's results will not be repeated during 2015.
